THE ARTS ROLE IN COMMUNITY RESILIENCE

This fact sheet from FEMA on the intersection of art, emergency management, and community resilience provides an overview of what emergency managers, artists, and art and culture organizations need to harness the strength of the arts and fortify communities, champion equity, and build local community resilience.

Wyoming Arts Council offers a professional development matching grant to reimburse costs of up to \$1,000. This grant is specifically designed to help grow the capacity of organizations and individuals that work in, and support the arts. Projects can include but are not limited to board development, leadership development, conference attendance, professional development training, fundraising development, strategic planning, creation of marketing plans, equipment purchases, etc.

ADOLPH AND ESTHER GOTTLIEB EMERGENCY GRANT www.gottliebfoundation.org/emergency-grant

To be eligible for the Adolph and Esther Gottlieb Emergency Grant, artists needs to show they've been seriously active for ten years. The award is for interim financial assistance for unforeseen, catastrophic incidents, and who lack resources to meet that situation. Each grant is given as one-time for a specific emergency, such as due to fire, flood, or emergency medical need.

THE ARTISTS' FELLOWSHIP, INC. www.artistsfellowship.org

The Artists' Fellowship, Inc. is a 501 (c)(3) private charitable foundation that financially assists professional visual artists and their families in times of emergency, disability or bereavement. Assistance is given without expectation of repayment. One does not need to be a member of the Fellowship to receive assistance nor does membership in the Artists' Fellowship entitle one to assistance from the foundation.

CRAFT EMERGENCY RELIEF FUND (CERF+) certplus.org/get-relief/apply-for-help/

The Craft Emergency Relief Fund (CERF+) emergency relief grant focuses on artists working in craft or materials-based folk/traditional disciplines that are 18 years or older and have resided and worked in the U.S. or U.S. territories for the past 2 years. These artists must have experienced a recent, unforeseen, career threatening emergency.
